City of Houston Alcohol Sales Guidelines

1. City Liquor License Process

The City of Houston has updated its procedures for obtaining the Certificate of City Secretary required by the Texas Alcoholic Beverage Commission (TABC) as part of its prequalification process.

2. Application Scope & Requirements

Before applying with the City, applicants must first complete the appropriate **TABC** application.

To proceed with the City's portion of the licensing process, applicants must:

- Submit a certified survey of the proposed alcohol-sales location.
 - The survey must be prepared by a **Texas licensed surveyor or state-licensed engineer**.
 - The survey must indicate distances from the property to nearby schools, public hospitals, and religious institutions.
 - o The survey must be dated within 60 days of submitting the TABC application.
- Submit a signed and notarized affidavit acknowledging:
 - o Awareness of the location-based restrictions for alcohol sales.
 - Understanding that violations may result in suspension or revocation of certification.

Verification & Certification:

- Once submitted, the **Administration and Regulatory Affairs (ARA) Section** will review the documents.
- Upon approval, the City will certify the application and provide you with certification for execution by the City Secretary.

3. Minimum Distance Requirements

The following minimum distance requirements must be met unless an exception is granted:

- 1. 300 feet from a religious institution
 - Measured from front door to front door, including any public entrance leading to the sanctuary.
- 2. 300 feet from day care centers designated as Alcohol-Free Zones

- Day Care Centers Alcohol Free Zones (300 feet)
 - 1. Heights Preschool (2064 Oxford St.)
 - 2. Messiah Lutheran Early Childhood Ctr. (5103 Rose St.)
- 3. 300 feet from a public hospital
 - Measured front door to front door.
- 4. 300 feet from a public or private school
 - Measured property line to property line.
- 5. 1000 feet from designated Alcohol-Free Zones
 - School District or Private School with Alcohol-Free Zones
 - 1. Spring Branch Independent School District
 - 2. Houston Independent School District
 - 3. Alief Independent School District
 - 4. Incarnate Word Academy (609 Crawford St.)
 - 5. St. Mark Lutheran School (1515 Hillendahl Blvd.)
 - 6. SER-Nino's Charter School (5815 Alder Dr.)
 - 7. Aldine Independent School District
 - 8. St. Agnes Academy (9000 Bellaire Blvd.)
 - 9. Strake Jesuit College Prep. (8900 Bellaire Blvd.)
 - 10. St. Stephens Episcopal Sch. (1805 W. Alabama St.)

4. Distance Measurement Certification Checklist

To ensure compliance, use the following guidelines for measuring distances:

- **Schools**: Measured from the alcohol-sales property's boundary to the school's property line. (*Refer to the attached HISD school map.*)
- Religious Institutions: Measured from the front door or sanctuary entrance to the proposed establishment's front door.
 - (See the attached diagram illustrating distance measurement across street intersections.)
- Public Hospitals: Measured from the hospital's front door to the establishment's front door.

6. Standard Issuance

- No school or church within 300 ft. of applicant's location.
- No school with an alcohol-free zone less than 1000 ft. away.
- 7. Exception (Grandfather, TABC Authorized)
 - Investigator finds a church less than 300 ft. way)
 - o Investigator finds a public or private school less than 300 ft. away
 - Investigator finds a school with an alcohol-free zone less than 1000' away and the applicant is applying as a bar or liquor store.

 Location has an alcohol permit that has been active for longer than the school or church nearby.

8. Temporary Issuance

- o Investigator finds a School with an Alcohol-Free Zone nearby
- The location is less than 1000 ft. away, but over 300 ft. away
- The applicant is applying for a FB Permit if applying for onpremises permit
- Applicant must submit affidavit every year showing that their annual revenue is less than 50% in alcohol sales
 - 1. Grocery stores total sales must be less than 25% in alcohol sales

Exceptions to Distance Requirements

Certain exceptions to distance requirements may be granted under City ordinances:

a. Restaurants Near Schools:

- Under Section 3-2(g) of the Houston Code of Ordinances, restaurants may be allowed to operate within 300 feet of a school.
- Requires a binding covenant agreement between:
 - o The restaurant owner,
 - o The property owner, and
 - o The City of Houston.

To request this exception, applicants must submit:

- 1. A written request for a restaurant exception package.
- 2. A copy of the **first pages** of current TABC Forms **L-IA** and **CERT**;
- 3. Copies of **two letters from Administration & Regulatory Affairs** (ARA) related to the variance request.
