At 9:07 a.m., Mayor Whitmire called the meeting of the Houston City Council to order and moved to the Mayor's Report.

MAYOR'S REPORT

Mayor Whitmire thanked City Directors and staff who worked around the clock during Winter Storm Fern. First responders, Public Works, the Health Department did a fantastic job. It was an impressive sight to see workers coming to the Emergency Center and other locations with their sleeping bags. We had over 1,000 individuals in the warming centers and those individuals were fed and protected. He also thanked Houstonians who heeded the advice and counsel and took precautions and prepared. We really demonstrated that City government does work. We'll have another arctic blast this weekend and we hope to get the most vulnerable off the streets. In other exciting news, there'll be a press conference this afternoon at 2pm with Houston First to announce that First Robotics is agreeing to bring their convention back to Houston for the next seven (7) years due to the expansion of the George R. Brown Convention Center. The expansion is due to the use of state funding which will double the size of the convention center at no cost to Houston taxpayers. It will have a \$500M economic impact over the next seven (7) years.
