The Three Communities











- A district shaped by thoughtful planning, diverse neighborhoods, and a shared commitment to quality living.

- All three neighborhoods deliver accessibility, comfort, and a sense of connection just minutes from central Houston.





The site is currently home to a 100-acre regional detention basin owned by the Harris County Flood Control District.

Tentatively scheduled to open in the fourth quarter of 2026, the new store represents a significant milestone for MUD 390, promising not only a place to shop but also a hub for community growth and connection.



Commitment To Keeping Our District Safe











Patrols and a greater presence of officers, Harris County MUD 390 is dedicated to their efforts to provide safety and security to the district, as highlighted by the following:

June 9, 2025, Safety and Security Meeting

Law enforcement agencies, elected officials, and community stakeholders came together to hear the concerns of the MUD 390 board of directors, who are committed to maintaining a safe and secure environment for all.

Shared Jurisdictions

MUD 390 is currently policed by two entities: Harris County Precinct 7 (City Park and City Oaks) and City Patrol (City Gate). The City Gate HOA has hired a private firm to patrol its community. Residents can look forward to increased patrols and a greater presence of officers in the district's residential and commercial areas.

Flock Camera Services

MUD 390 currently has 15 Flock Safety License Plate Readers in use, three of which were purchased by HOA communities. Communities that have implemented Flock Safety cameras have reported overall crime reductions of up to 70%, including fewer burglaries, car thefts, and robberies.

Improved Lighting and Fencing in Common Areas and Parks

The Cogburn Park Lighting Project aims to improve lighting in the area and deter illegal behavior and crime. First Light Technologies, the manufacturer of the solar light fixtures in City Oaks, has been asked to provide estimates for 5 to 6 overhead light poles along the Cogburn Park Trail.

The Cogburn Park Fencing Project would update the existing fence between Cogburn Park and repair, repaint, or replace the fence. New wrought iron fencing will be added along Cogburn Park Dr. on both sides of the entrance to provide an enclosure and help deter young occupants from running into the street.
