


## 2024 ANNUAL ACTION PLAN

#### What is an Annual Action Plan?




- Annual strategic plan with goals and objectives
- Allocates approximately \$53 million in federal entitlement funds to activities for Program Year 2024 (July 2024 – June 2025)
- The funds allocated go towards improving housing, public facilities, infrastructure, and quality of life for low- and moderate-income Houstonians

#### **2024 Anticipated Accomplishments**



#### Community Development Block Grant

- Provide public services to 12,701 people
- Provide services to 1,750 people to reduce homelessness
- Improve 4 public facilities
- **32,000** code enforcement visits
- Lead hazard abatement of 50 homes
- Repair or reconstruct 18 homes
- Direct financial assistance to 33 lowand moderate-income homebuyers

#### **2024 Anticipated Accomplishments**



Housing Opportunities for Persons with AIDS

- Provide Tenant-Based Rental Assistance for 450 households
- Provide 500 households with Short-Term Rental, Mortgage, or Utility Subsidies
- Provide funding for permanent or transitional facilities serving 220 households
- Provide supportive services to 1,700 households and housing information and resources to 125 households





# ESG Emergency Solutions Grants

Homelessness Prevention	\$ 353,561	16.6%

Homeless Management Information System (HMIS)	\$ 85,195	4.0%
TOTAL	\$ 2,129,884	100.0%

#### **2024 Anticipated Accomplishments**



#### **Emergency Solutions Grant**

- Assist 100 persons with homelessness prevention
- Assist 285 households with rapid re-housing services and rental assistance
- Fund operation of emergency shelters serving 1,000 persons


