Public Notice

The City of Houston (City) through its Housing and Community Development Department (HCDD) is proposing an Ordinance authorizing a Purchase and Sale Agreement between the City and 419 Hope Partners LLC for the purchase of the property located at 419 Emancipation Avenue Houston, TX 77003 (Property). The City will utilize \$16,000,000.00 of Reimbursement of Equipment/Projects Fund (Fund 1850) to finance the purchase. The Property will be used as a Super Hub for individuals experiencing homelessness in Houston. It will serve as a housing-focused triage site and provide temporary and transitional shelter, offering individuals living on the street a safe place of refuge while they are connected to services such as healthcare, psychiatric support, substance abuse programs, and pathways to housing stability.

The Property consists of two buildings. The first building has a full-service commercial kitchen, laundry facility, medical office spaces, gathering areas, and individual rooms with built-in bathrooms that can house up to four individuals. The second building is configured as a school, with multiple classrooms, a bathroom area, administrative offices, and a library area. The remaining land is utilized for parking, paved common areas and walkways, and landscaping.

Since 2003, the Property has been used as a shelter as described below:

- 2003 2016: The Star of Hope owned and operated the facility as a homeless shelter.
- 2017 2018: The City of Houston leased the facility and retained a provider to operate it to house Hurricane Harvey survivors.
- 2018 August 2025: The facility was subleased to a non-profit, Southwest Key Programs, Inc., to shelter unhoused immigrant youths.

The public has seven (7) days to comment on this proposed item. The 7-day period extends from Tuesday, October 7, 2025, through Tuesday, October 14, 2025.
