





Residential Permit Parking Program

What is the RPP?

- Limits on-street parking to residents and visitors with valid permits during the designated hours
- Designated hours are limited to 12 hours max per day
- Addresses chronic, long-term
 commuter parking problems
- Enhances the quality of life
- Helps limit public nuisances

RPP Limits

- Temporary commuter parking problems
- Special Events
- Commercial properties
- Vacant Lots
- Multi-family properties with more than 8 units
- School drop off and pick up






Residential Area

75% of the length of the curb adjacent to single-family residential properties

- HCAD designation
- 8 units or less







Residential Area

75% or more of the length of the curb





Non-Residential Area

Less than 75% of the length of the curb



Parking Survey

60% or more parking spaces occupied 25% of cars are commuter vehicles

Legal parking space is 20 feet
10 parking spaces
6 commuter vehicles
60% Occupancy





Traffic Survey

Measure street width Review mobility

26 feet or greater parking on both sides

20 - 25 feet parking on one side only

Less than 20 feet no parking zone

















Residential Permit Parking Signage

RPP Permits Are Digital

Assigned to a vehicle license plate







Resident Permit

Issued to vehicles registered to an address in the RPP area

Visitor and Service Provider Permits

Resident assigns permit to vehicle license plate as needed

Visitors - 4 per year

Service Provider - 2 per year

One-Day Pass

Valid for 24 hours Limit 100 per year



Permit Curbside Parking Requirements

- All vehicles must have a valid permit linked to their license plate during permit regulation hours
- All vehicles must park legally and follow all parking regulations
- Vehicles without valid permit linked to license plate are subject to tow
- Marked service vehicles do not require permits
- Permits do not guarantee a parking space
