Chair’s Report, David Bucek, Chair, announced speaker rules and meeting procedures.

Director’s Report, Robert Williamson, Secretary and Deputy Director for the Planning and Development Department, delivered two main announcements: The Norhill Design Guidelines will not be reviewed this month, staff is revising the final draft, guidelines are expected at the next commission. The chair has requested an upcoming HAHC workshop to discuss possible rules and procedures aimed at improving commission operations. This workshop will help develop recommendations for future commission consideration. Highlighted the month of April; 3 pre-application design review requests were received, 46 new Certificate of Appropriateness (COA) applications were submitted, year-to-date totals now stand at 24 pre-application reviews and 163 COA submissions. Staff administratively approved 17 COAs during this cycle, bringing the year-to-date administrative approval total to 48.
