

## Notice to Adult Victims of Family Violence

It is a crime for any person to intentionally cause you any harm, even if that person is a member of your household. It is important that you tell the officer if you or any other household resident have been injured, or if you feel you are going to be in danger after the officer leaves.

The **Family Violence Division** investigates crimes within the city limits of Houston involving victims who are or were personally connected to the offender. These relationships include spouses, ex-spouses, family members, dating partners, intimate partners, roommates, and family members of an individual's current spouse. Our division handles crimes such as assault, harassment, threat to life, violation of a protective order, and interfering with child custody. Our division also handles incidents in which the victim is a juvenile between 15-17 years of age.

These advocates support crime victims and their families by offering guidance, helping with applications for Crime Victims' Compensation, and connecting them with available benefits and services.
